



4D3N Cambodia Tour

Phnom Penh & Siem Reap

Tour Code : PNH4DCAM-PTM (GV2)(PTMPS4D3N)

Day 01 : SINGAPORE ✈ PHNOM PENH (Meal-On-Board / Lunch / Dinner)

Pick up from airport and transfer hotel (room may not ready until the afternoon) Visit the **Independent Monument**, and the **National Museum**, also called Musee des Beaux-Arts. A French archaeologist and painter, Georges Groslier, designed it in Khmer style in 1917. The museum contains a collection of Khmer art, notably sculptures from throughout the ages. Visit the **Royal Palace** – built by King Norodom in 1866 on the site of the old town and the **Silver Pagoda**. Located within the grounds of the Royal Palace, the Silver Pagoda is so named because of its floor, which is made up of 5,000 silver tiles. The treasures found inside include a solid gold Buddha encrusted and weighing 90kg and a small 17th century emerald and baccarat crystal Buddha. End your morning with a visit to the **Wat Phnom** Temple – Phnom Penh's namesake, from where you can enjoy views over the tree-lined avenues of the city.

Lunch at local restaurant.

Afternoon, visit the notorious **Tuol Sleng Museum** – in 1975, Tuol Svay Prey High School was taken over by Pol Pot's security forces and turned into a prison known as Security Prison 21 (S-21). The museum's displays include room after room of photographs of men, women and children covering the walls from floor to ceiling; virtually all the people pictured were later killed. Visit the **Russian Market** (Psah Tuol Thom Pong) – a lively outdoor market where you will find antiques, silver and gold jewellery, gems, silk, kramas, stone and wood carvings, as well as T-Shirts, CDs and other souvenirs.

Dinner at local restaurant and accommodation at hotel.

Day 02 : PHNOM PENH ➡ SIEM REAP (5-6 hrs) (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)

After breakfast at the hotel, depart for Siem Reap by coach (approximately 5-6 hours). Upon arrival, transfer to hotel for check-in.

Lunch at local restaurant.

First visit in Siem Reap will be the floating village of **Chong Khneas** – located 10km south of Siem Reap. Take a traditional wooden boat ride on the **Tonle Sap Lake** – the "Great Lake" of Cambodia and one of the largest in Asia. Next, visit "**Les Artisans d'Angkor – Chantiers Ecoles**" of Siem Reap and thereafter, free time at leisure at the **local market**.

Dinner at local restaurant and accommodation at hotel.

Day 03 : SIEM REAP (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)

After breakfast at hotel, visit the most famous of all the temples on the plain of Angkor – **Angkor Wat**. The temple complex covers 81 hectares and is comparable in size to the Imperial Palace in Beijing. Its distinctive five towers are emblazoned on the Cambodian flag and the 12th century masterpiece is considered by art historians to be the prime example of classical Khmer art and architecture. Angkor Wat's five towers symbolize Meru's five peaks – the enclosed wall represents the mountains at the edge of the world and the surrounding moat, the ocean beyond.

Lunch at local restaurant.

Visit the ancient capital of **Angkor Thom** (12th century). See the **South Gate** with its huge statues depicting the churning of the ocean of milk, the **Royal Enclosure**, **Phimeanakas**, the **Elephants Terrace**, the **Terrace of the Leper King** and **Bayon Temple** (unique for its 54 towers decorated with over 200 smiling faces of Avolokitesvara), which is of similar design to the Jayavarman VII temples; this quiet sprawling monastic complex is only partially cleared of jungle overgrowth. Intentionally left partially un-restored, massive fig and silk cotton trees grow from the towers and corridors, offering some of the best 'tree-in temple' photo opportunities at Angkor Wat until **sunset at Bakheng Mountain**.

Dinner local restaurant and accommodation at hotel.

Day 04 : SIEM REAP ✈ SINGAPORE (Breakfast / Meal-On-Board)

Breakfast at the hotel. Thereafter, free at leisure until your departure transfer to the airport for your flight back to Singapore, bringing home fond memories of Cambodia.

Important Notes:-

- US Dollars are widely used in Cambodia.
- Proper attire must be worn (no sleeveless tops, shorts & Bermudas) when visiting The Royal Palace and Silver Pagoda. And a pair of comfortable walking shoes is recommended when visiting Angkor Wat.
- Due to hot weather, it is recommended to bring along a hat or umbrella and a bottle of water.
